Rules Governing these Alliance Junior Championships

1. These Championships shall be governed by the entry conditions set out below, which may from time to time vary with the Rule Book currently in print.
2. Competitors must be Junior Boxers (British or Non-British) and must be registered with the Amateur Boxing Alliance (England) CIC. Competitors must represent the Club on the entry form throughout the Championships. They must have had a minimum of 2 Alliance bouts on entry. They must declare numbers of competitive bouts in other combat sports. These numbers must be entered at the top of page 1 on the medical card.
Acceptance of entry does not necessarily imply that the entrant is eligible or that he will be allowed to compete. Those in doubt as to their eligibility should refer their case to the Hon. Secretary of their Association, or to the Alliance office.
Non- British competitors must have held a medical card for 1 year from the date of their first medical entered in their card.
3. An intending competitor may only enter through one Association and box in one weight. Should a competitor be too light or too heavy for the weight at which he entered the Championships he may transfer to his correct weight at the initial weigh-in. He cannot transfer to a different weight category after the first stage of the Championships
4. The entry form must be signed by the competitor, giving his correct name, date of birth and address. A parent or guardian, who will be held responsible for the correctness of the statement made thereon, must endorse the entry form. The Hon. Secretary of the competitor's club or organisation must also sign the entry form, to verify that the competitor's details are correct.
5. By entering these Championships, a competitor's parent or guardian will have been deemed to give consent to allow his name, photographs and video footage to be used in all media for publicity purposes, if required.
6. Weight Allowance, after the Association Finals onwards: boxers up to 50kgs - 300gms, up to 63.5kgs - 500gms, over 63.5kgs - 700gms.
7. During the 2-hour Weigh in period boxers up to 50kgs category may lose a maximum of 300grams, up to 63.5kgs- 500 grams. and over 63.5kgs- 700 grams. Boxers may have as many check weighs as they wish up to the official closure of the scales.
8. Competitors must wear boxing shorts or underpants when weighing-in.
9. Gloves - all boxers will wear 10oz Alliance approved and stamped gloves, supplied by the organisers.
10. Competitors may bring their own second who must wear white or plain grey trousers and white vest or white shirt or white sweater. Training shoes or boxing boots must be worn. Tracksuits or white jackets are permitted.
No head wear at ringside. Mobile phones must be switched off when at ringside.
11. Medical record cards must be produced at the time of time of weighing in at all stages of the Championships.
12. For the Pre Quarter Final and Quarter Final matches, appointed Officials will be paid expenses by their own Association.
Official's expenses for the Semi Finals and Finals to be paid by the Alliance.
13. All boxers shall wear a gum shield, cup protector, Alliance approved bandages on the hands and an Alliance approved and stamped head guard when competing. No red gum shields may be worn.
14. Where both boxers in the eliminating round of a weight class are disqualified the Association or Associations jointly concerned will be permitted to nominate a representative to the next stage provided the nominee has entered and weighed-in for his Association Championships.
15. All participants i.e. boxers and coaches, are reminded that these Championships are subject to the Alliance Anti-Doping Rules.
- 16 The scoring machine shall not be used at any round of the Championships. At the Regional Association Finals, Pre 1/4 Finals, 1/4 Finals, Semi- Finals and Finals, 5 judges using scoring counters shall be used.
17. If there is no opponent for a boxer to compete in the National Final, he will be only be awarded the National Title if he has boxed at an earlier stage.
18. If necessary, to define the 'belt' line, competitors will be required to wear the appropriate colour sash.
No boxer shall wear a RED vest in the BLUE corner or a BLUE vest the RED corner.
19. All boxers SHALL wear a RED head guard and gloves in the RED corner and a BLUE head guard and gloves in the BLUE corner.
20. All boxers shall be clean-shaven before presenting themselves to the tournament Medical Officer.
21. Classes A, B and C will box 3 x 2 minute rounds.
22. The entry fee of £10 must accompany each application.
